

# Prior to 2015

Mad River Township resident Dan Demmy purchased multiple land parcels in Mad River Township in the 1980's. Records available show deeds of some of these parcels were then transferred to Buddy Boy Farms and Edwin and Carolyn LLC in 2009. These properties were added to IM 0375 permit (issued 6/6/77) unbeknownst to the community.

In addition, in 2007 and 2009 ODNR approved blasting and dewatering modifications to the 21.8 acres owned by Demmy under permit IM 0340 (issued 4/25/77). These modifications resulted in the documented dewatering of three home wells.

## **FEBRUARY, 2008**

Surface mining permit IM 0340 renewed (expires 4-2022).

## **OCTOBER 20, 2016**

DMRM approved the surface mining amendment on permit IM 0340, increasing 21.8 acres to 420.6 acres and designating mining areas 2, 3 and 4.

**MAY 1**

A letter was sent from Allan Neimayer, Senior Planner of the office of Clark County Community and Economic Development, to ES&G notifying the company of the requirement for a conditional use permit prior to any mining activity.

**MAY 11**

C.Culbertson received a response letter regarding the fens from DMRM. Lanny Erdos states “review is limited to determining whether the modifications comply with Chapter 1514 of the Ohio Revised Code. If those standards are met, the Division is obligated to issue the permit.”

**MAY 15**

Brent Huntsman, Chief Hydrogeologist, Terran Corporation, hand delivered report to Chief Lanny Erdos outlining the deficiencies and misrepresentations in the EAI hydrology model and report.

**JUNE 19, 2017**

Mad River Township Trustees received second letter from DMRM acknowledging receipt of submitted information by Brent Huntsman. The groundwater drawdown, wetlands and zoning ordinances were topics covered in the letter. Tyson Lamielle stated “the Ohio EPA and the U. S. Army Corp of Engineers have authority over wetlands.”

Reclamation Commission Hearing is held over a three month period with members from DMRM, ES&G, CAM present.

**APRIL 24, 2018**

Ohio EPA conducted a field study at [Culbertson](#), [Vanderglas](#), [Partington SpringHouse](#) and mining properties. Geologist, fish and wetland specialists accompanied Robert Ostendorf to each site. Mike See, Environmental Specialist, confirmed two category 3 wetland fens, one category 2 wetland and one category 1 wetland on the mining property.

**MAY 19**

Ohio EPA met with the five community groups to update and answer questions. In attendance were members of CAM, Tecumseh Land Trust, BW Greenway Community Land Trust, Trout Unlimited and the Mad River Township Trustees.

1. Determine if the pumping of ground water, the removal of overburden or the removal of carbonate bedrock from the proposed mining site, will have any impact upon the present wetland acreage or designated use.
2. Determine if the pumping of ground water, the removal of overburden or the removal of carbonate bedrock from the proposed mining site, will have any impact upon Mud Run or the unnamed tributaries of Mud Run.
3. Determine if the unnamed tributary or Mud Run will be impacted should both Phase one (1) and Phase two (2) of the proposed mining project be completed as proposed.

\* "Please submit a proposed plan of action which outlines how Enon Sand & Gravel will make the above listed determinations... the requested plan of action would be provided within 60 days of the date of this letter (November 23, 2018)."

**December 21, 2018**

A letter and an email were sent by the Ohio EPA to all “interested parties” reporting the completion of their document, Response to Comments. This document addressed comments and concerns of citizens given at the February 1 Ohio EPA Public Hearing.
